THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Notice that the book of Acts is a continuation of the narrative begun in the book of Luke. It was written by the same writer, Luke, to the same person, Theophilus (Acts 1:1; Luke 1:3b), who was possibly a Roman official, and probably a Christian. While the gospels tell what Jesus *began* to do and teach (Acts 1:1), the book of Acts tells what Jesus *continued* to do and teach--no longer in person--but through the apostles, as they were empowered by the Holy Spirit. PETER'S FIRST MIRACLE

We have seen from our previous studies that the main purpose of the Holy Spirit's coming was to give the disciples power in their witness for Christ. The first power He gave them was the ability to speak in other languages, since there were foreigners in Jerusalem just for the feast who could not be reached except in this way. Then He gave to Peter the power to preach about Jesus, so that about 3,000 were saved. Now see what additional power was given to Peter in the following lesson:

THE CHURCH AT ANTIOCH

Acts 11:19 - 30, 12:25 - 13:4

In the first great division of the book of Acts, *chapters 1-12*, the main character was Peter, and he ministered mainly to the *Jews* in the city of *Jerusalem*. But in chapter 13, the second main division begins, and all this is changed. In the following lessons, seek to discover why, and to learn the new main character, city, and people reached:

A. The Founding of the Church at Antioch: Read Acts 11:19-21
